25 years ago, I first landed on the Sepik River in Papua New Guinea (PNG), deeply committed to serving isolated communities through emergency medical flights and sharing the love of Jesus. Today, thanks to your partnership, Samaritan Aviation has grown in ways only God could orchestrate.

We've delivered thousands of life-saving flights, hundreds of thousands of pounds of medicine, and countless messages of Gospel hope to those living in some of the most remote areas on earth. But our calling doesn't stop there. As we look to the future, we believe God is asking us to go deeper and reach farther.

Deeper Roots

Incredible opportunities are within reach for deepening the roots of Samaritan Aviation, as local Papua New Guinean leaders faithfully carry out this ministry. One crucial opportunity is purchasing a hangar we currently lease. As the hub of our entire operations, and the only hangar in Wewak, this purchase is critical for the sustainability of our ministry.

Additionally, building on the land we purchased from our last campaign, the Training Center deepens our roots as it will allow for discipleship training and the ability to host missions teams from around the world. This truly opens future opportunities we have been dreaming of for exponential impact in PNG.

Longer Reach

With these roots, the sky is the limit. The first stop in our longer reach is completing the dock (seaplane lift installation, roof, and 75% additional dock space) and building staff houses in our expansion to the Gulf Province! This allows us to launch life-saving services in a new region where the need is urgent.

Here's why this truly matters-Every flight we make is a lifeline not only for physical healing but for eternal hope found in Christ. We invite you to join us in establishing deeper roots so we can extend a longer reach of hope for the people of Papua New Guinea.

Kesalyn was a young mother battling drug-resistant tuberculosis along with her 2-year-old daughter. We flew both of them to the hospital, where over the course of their extended treatment, our team visited Kesalyn 53 times. Each visit was an opportunity to remind her of God's unwavering love and share the life-changing message of the Gospel.

Kesalyn eagerly participated in 70 lessons of our Kingdom of Glory curriculum, a Creation-to-Christ model of sharing the Gospel in her language, and began studying on her own as well. The day after she finished the discipleship program she unexpectedly passed away. While her earthly life didn't end the way we hoped and prayed it would, we rejoice that this opportunity allowed her to hear and accept the Gospel for the first time!

EAST SEPIK PROVINCE PROJECTS

Land for future homes and operations

We secured and began development on 2.2 acres of land. We have completed initial landworks of sewage and foundation preparation.

6 Staff family homes and a duplex

These 4BR and 3BR homes will provide the safety and security needed for our missionary families.



GULF PROVINCE EXPANSION PROJECTS

Additional Seaplane because the needs keep growing

We were able to purchase what will be our fourth seaplane in PNG for the Gulf because the needs keep growing. In 2023, flights increased by 40%.

Phase 1 floating dock and dredging machine purchased

In order to prepare the area for our future dock in the gulf, we purchased a dredger for our long-term success and have installed Phase 1 of the floating dock.

 We have now completed 5 different medical outreaches in 14 different villages in the Gulf Province.

PHASE 1 UPDATE:

Due to inflation and the depreciation of the Papua New Guinean currency-the Kina-we're finishing the Training Center in Phase 2. This is at the forefront of our Phase 2 expansion!

PHASE 2

THE NEXT SEASON OF SAMARITAN IS OWNERSHIP AND EXPANSION

This is our next milestone-\$3,415,000 will get us there.

Deeper Roots in the East Sepik means raising \$2.145 million to move from lease to ownership.

\$840,000

To add a training center and to finish developing the land at our base.

\$420,000

To purchase the only hangar in Wewak that we currently lease.

\$255,000

Additional vehicle, PNG staff, and resources for ministry outreach.

\$630,000

Avionics upgrade, engine overhaul, and paint for 2 current PNG seaplanes.

Longer Reach in the Gulf means raising \$1.270 million to expand to other provinces.

\$540,000

Purchasing and building 2 staff homes for our missionaries to have a safe and secure place to live.

\$300,000

Expanding the dock along with installing a lift and roof is critical to long-term operations in the Gulf.

\$190,000

Additional vehicle, PNG staff, and resources for ministry outreach.

\$240,000


Avionics upgrade, shipping/import of additional seaplane for the Gulf.

DEEPER ROOTS



"Deeper Roots" strengthens our capacity to reach remote communities, train local leaders, and sustain life-changing ministry across Papua New Guinea for generations to come.

To do this, we need to raise \$2,145,000.

HANGAR | \$420,000


Located in East Sepik, the only hangar in Wewak is the headquarters for all Papua New Guinean aviation. Securing the purchase of this Hangar (currently leased) will be crucial to the growth of our ministry.

This is also the hub for all major maintenance and repair done on the airplanes, offices for our staff to work from, and cold storage for much-needed medicine that we deliver to remote villages.

This hangar will be sold. If we don't purchase it, someone else will.

TRAINING CENTER | \$840,000

A permanent Training Center will equip leaders in East Sepik while also allowing us to host leaders from all over Papua New Guinea to be discipled and trained, multiplying ministry potential in additional regions. This will deepen the roots for both local and missionary families to be able to stay long-term and invest fully in the mission of Samaritan Aviation.



UPGRADES FOR 3 SEAPLANES IN PNG | \$630,000

We need to keep our planes safe to fly. This includes flying the seaplanes to Australia for engine overhauls, corrosion repair, general window and interior refurbishments, and new paint, along with major avionics upgrades.

MINISTRY RESOURCES | \$255,000


As we continue to build our Papua New Guinean team, we need to provide medical training and equipment for the ministry. We also need another vehicle for our East Sepik location that will provide necessary transportation for staff to the hangar and the hospital for ministry purposes. This increases our ability to minister to patients.

GULF EXPANSION God has opened the doors for ministry in the Gulf. With our Phase 2 goals in this southern province, we'll be ready to expand our reach across Papua New Guinea!

To do this, we need to raise \$1,270,000.

STAFF HOMES | \$540,000

As we expand to the Gulf, we need homes for our families doing the critical work there. These are more than homesthey provide safety and security for our missionary families.

SEAPLANE DOCK | \$300,000


We're expanding the dock by 75%! In addition, finalizing the lift and roof installation for this dock will provide a safe place for the planes to be parked, a place to do maintenance, and weather /overnight security. We can't operate long-term without it.

MINISTRY OUTREACH | \$190,000

We're training and equipping a Papua New Guinean team with medical skills, essential tools, and gospel resources like audio Bibles and our Kingdom of Glory curriculum. To support their ministry and medical work, we also need a vehicle for transportation.

AVIATION EXPANSION | \$240,000


Thanks to your support in Phase I, we acquired an additional seaplane. We're now shipping it to Papua New Guinea and upgrading its avionics to better serve the growing needs in the Gulf Province.
